For some, the “stay at home” order has resulted in a loss of work or a very different work environment with regards to new health and safety regulations.

For me, as a telecommuter, working from home for more than a decade, the changes in day to day living are minimal. There are definitely some changes that require getting used to, such as having my children home, all day, every day. With the “distance learning” policy for public schools, my wife and I are now also part-time teachers. The travel my wife had for work has been temporarily canceled, and there has been a schedule shift in our house at times, so that she can work with an Eastern Time Zone client that she would have been on-site for. Neither of us are experiencing a sudden surplus of time. Due to new government regulations as a response to the pandemic, my work has actually increased so that the financial institution I work for remains in compliance and offers our members opportunities for relief.

For Cornerstone Lodge, the impact has been much greater. In addition to the two officer’s meetings and two stated meetings that we are missing, we have also had to cancel our Annual Spring (Easter) Breakfast this year. The proceeds from the breakfast are donated to the Community Transitional School which is currently closed under the executive order, but is still providing food to the families of their students. Hopefully, we can find a way to continue our support of this school and its mission.

When the executive order is lifted, we will reschedule the two degrees that have been postponed from March. At this time, we are still planning on having Table Lodge in June and our Picnic in July, subject to the directives of Grand Lodge and our State Government. Until we can again greet each other with hugs and handshakes, please follow the guidelines provided by the CDC and OHA to stay healthy. Anyone needing assistance should contact myself or the Wardens and we will make arrangements.
